Since 2011, Mr. Gabriele Cascone works at the Strategic Analysis Capability (SAC) Section of NATO, he drafts strategic assessments focused on the security situation in the Middle East and North Africa region for the Secretary General and Chairman of the NATO Military Committee. He worked for the NATO Office of Security, the PASP Division, and for MENA and Gulf partners. Prior to NATO, he entered in the Italian Military Academy in 1984, being commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant in the Carabinieri Corps. Then served as an active duty officer from 1986 to 1998. He studied law at the University of Parma (Italy), then received a M.A. in International Relations at the Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB).
